Notes:

1. The student chooses one of the four directions offered within the educational program. The amount of credits determined by the direction must be covered by the student in full.
2. It is mandatory to confirm knowledge of English at B2.2 level or achieve it within the program. The student confirms the level of competence of the English language by an internal university exam, in accordance with the "rules for determining the language competence of Central University of Europe students";
3. Within the framework of the program, the student starts learning English from the level confirmed according to the "Rules for determining the language competence of Central University of Europe students". In the event that the student fails to confirm his/her knowledge of the English language at the A2 level, he/she starts learning English within the program from the appropriate level confirmed according to the mentioned rule (English Language A1 / English Language A2). The student learns the levels necessary to start at the B1.1 level of English (English Language A1/English Language A2) by utilizing the free credits provided by the program;
4. In case the student confirms his/her knowledge of the English language at the B2.2 level in accordance with the mentioned rule, he/she acquires the amount of credits intended for the foreign language (20 credits) in the main study area of the program, with optional courses of direction. If the level confirmed by the student is higher than the initial level determined by the program (B1.1), the student fills up the remaining credits by covering the credits of the optional study courses of the main study area;
5. Credits of the free component, within the framework of which the student is given the opportunity to choose study courses from any educational program of the relevant level operating in the university, can be covered by elective (including direction elective) study courses of the main study area of the law educational program.
6. Within the framework of the study courses, where the requirement to know the English language is specified as a prerequisite for admission (referring to the study course "English Language for Lawyers"), English-language textbook(s) are used as mandatory literature.
